During our current cruise aboard the Queen Victoria, a simple idea from fellow Catenian, Bro. Tom McGovern of Aberdeen Circle (107), has grown into something far more profound. What started as an informal gathering for daily prayer among four passengers has blossomed into a vibrant Rosary Group, now bringing together thirteen passengers from all walks of life and nationalities in a shared sense of spiritual purpose as we journey together.

It is no surprise that this modest initiative has gained such momentum. Each day, more passengers join us, eager to participate in this prayerful solidarity. What began as a simple act has now become a regular feature of our days at sea, as we gather to pray for peace, guidance and unity.

On the following Sunday, January 26th, we were fortunate to be in Barbados, where our Rosary Group, along with passengers from other cruise ships in the area, gathered at the stunning Cathedral of Saint Patrick for a truly uplifting live Mass.
